Even and unnumbered addresses can use outdoor water on Mondays, Wednesdays and Saturdays, odd numbered addresses on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Sundays. Residents are still strongly encouraged to continue water conservation efforts. The history of drought in the Southeast region demonstrates the
